**Discussions:**

Transition Tuesdays

On 5 of the short Tuesday TAs, we would encourage everyone to go to TA and engage in a discussion about the transition to the new building, some of it would be discussion, activity, questions, "what are you excited about?"

Caroline: discuss parking and transportation, especially for after school events. Also what about the first day of school? What tradition are we keeping

Charlotte: Going in to the building early?

Dave: what is on campus and what is off campus? Interaction with larger community? Maybe present a map of larger business around us.

Graham: Another thing: Traffic and being a pedestrian in that area is completely different down in Roslyn then it is here.

Drivers are a little worse there.

Ahmad: Rules about the fire station?

Graham: big wall around it, frisbees won't get into it. We're going to try to become good neighbors with firefighters.

John: Using resources in that area (example: metro)

Dan: we're going to be 2 blocks from the metro. What are the restrictions With the metro? Going into DC for the day vs. Roslyn area.

Dave; On map your day, predict where senior couches or where you will hang out will be. What's the junior area? Also we really need to have off campus-on campus conversation

Niles: Natural consequence for going into DC.... You're marked as absent. We don't really need to have rules implemented and our students are self directed.

Casey: agrees with Dave about hang out spots. Maybe we don't have an exclusive area for senior couches and are more together As a community.

Graham: elevator etiquette discussion. Efficiency of using an elevator? It might

take you longer to take the elevator than the stairs.

Eleanor: all areas should not be closed off to everyone. Maybe we need to get rid of senior couches because they are exclusive.

Dan: Reply to Niles; we should know where everyone is if there is an emergency (example: metro breakdown in DC)

Vivienne: Elevator keys? Casey: we hope students know when to use the elevator if they need it, most Stratford students have classes on G and 1, expectation for students is to take the stairs and let Stratford use the elevators since they need it more.

Brooke: we should let people feel out the building before they decide where they hang out, can't plan that type of stuff. We shouldn't ignore DC since it will be so close and be a great metro resource.

Lex: If you are a junior or senior who can drive you're just as liable to be as far away now as you would be next year. Senior couches: underclass men look forward to senior classes so getting rid of them kind of takes away the specialness away.

Neal: to Dan: are you worried about kids in DC?

Dan: you are not in the state of VA anymore and I just care about safety? (Sorry I didn't get it all)

Paul: TAKE THE STAIRS!!!!!!! I have kids at W-1 who take the stairs and it's 3 flights. **“If you don't want your kids riding the metro, don't send them to H-B” - PAUL WEISS, 2019**
