

Out and About (Off Campus Projects)

Abingdon - Study Buddies: When you sign up and pick a grade level to work with.

- 1) Kindergarten room: Assistance recording students reading a book
- 2) First Grade room: Read aloud to groups of 3 first graders
- 3) 4th grade special education room: Lead the students through an ART project (drawing related) or help them use their iPad to design a mini graphic novel.
- 4) 5th grade classroom: Helping kids do research

AFAC: Volunteer to help bag groceries for local families in need.

Arlington Transportation: Bike to Rosslyn and hear from department of transportation about how to safely navigate our new neighborhood.

ASPAN Cooking: Our service group will prepare a meal for those experiencing homelessness in Arlington, to be delivered to the Arlington Street People's Assistance Center. We'll be planning and cooking a dinner from scratch for 35 people.

ASPAN Sandwiches: Our service group will prepare sandwiches for those experiencing homelessness in Arlington, to be delivered to the Arlington Street People's Assistance Center.

- 3) Work with students on art projects

Carlin Springs- Work in their Kindergarten classrooms from 10 - 10:30, then go upstairs to fourth grade classrooms from 10:30 - 11:30 to serve as reading buddies/models.

Daingerfield Island: Planting trees for future transplantation on the National Mall with the National Park Service.

Drew: Assist Drew in cleaning up their outdoor space and giving it a fresh coat of paint. May be helping other teachers as needed.

Gulf Branch Nature Center: Come pull invasive mustard!

Long Branch Nature- Trail Restoration: Help restore the trail for the spring and summer seasons!

Projects At HB

Welcome to the Heights: Participants will engage in projects and discussions aimed at making us feel at home in our new space from the very beginning of next year. Projects may include making "Welcome Back" signs for the first week of school, making artistic signs for each classroom, and other pieces of artwork that could brighten the hallways.

Goodbye Vacation Lane: Participants will discuss both how we as a community want to say goodbye to this building, and how we can make the transition easier for incoming students at Dorothy Hamm. Projects may include helping to get ready for the party on May 25th, making signs to put up for Dorothy Hamm students to familiarize themselves with the school, and writing letters to future Dorothy Hamm teachers to give them a history of their classroom.

Getting Around: Participants will discuss and create materials to facilitate getting to and from the Heights from around Arlington, and to facilitate finding our way around the new building in the first few days. Projects may include making transportation brochures that lay

out bike paths and bus routes, and signs for internal stairwells to remind students which teachers and classrooms are on which floors.

HB Community and Traditions: This will be a chance for students to learn about and reflect on the history of some of H-B's traditions over the years. Participants will use some historical information and the results of brainstorming from Transition Tuesdays to generate ideas for transferring traditions like Turkey Bowl and the First Day Assembly to the new building

Cleanliness and Sustainability: Participants will brainstorm how to manage trash, recycling, compost, green space, and other topics relating to sustainability in the new building. They will also spend some time taking care of our current location by picking up trash along Lee Highway.

History of HB: Participants will learn about the history of H-B Woodlawn from its founding up till the move, and will work on ways to document and memorialize that history in a visually engaging exhibit that can be displayed in the new building.

Packing at HB: Help HB get ready to move by packing up rooms around the building. Art, theater, and Physics need current students to help pack. Students not in those classes will help pack up other teachers around the building.
