- -In the past, a number of fab fests have struggled to use 2 hours fully Planning 2 hour lessons are significant chunks of time -Possible 9:45 start time to allow for a checking with TAs and allow people to get their bearings
- -Wednesday schedule would be morning classes, Thursday would be afternoon
- -^possible issue with the parttime teachers
- -Fab Fest is two mornings
- -Maybe Fab fest should be morning and afternoon rather than switching classes around

Use of personal devices (outside of class mostly)

- -Graham collected iPads and phones at lunch, some fine, some very not fine. What are we as a community doing about personal device overuse?
- -Somewhat of an issue, willing to experiment, but hard to take concrete action to avoid it
- -Devices critical for doing work
- -A bigger issue in the younger grades
- -Collecting devices goes against personal responsibility and trust
- -Can't assume people are being unproductive on their devices
- -Not really a question of making rules, this should be a word to the wise about positive electronic usage. Important not to be tied to a device during formative years
- -Possibly having one day a week where no devices during lunch

- -High schoolers could take that time also to get off their devices and engage with middle schoolers
- -Really a problem for the whole school, even teachers
- -Mass confiscation is never going to happen. This discussion is not about restriction. The question is, are teachers doing students a disservice by not doing anything? Studies have shown social media has been linked to increased mental health issues in teens. Students absolutely have a choice in this matter. This is not about the logistics of Graham walking around with a box. Is there a will for this?
- -One of the greatest gifts you can give someone is undivided attention.
- -Having this conversation is extremely important and a very HB thing to do

- -Where do we trust students? Where do we need to make a change?
- -Students should model positive social media behavior
- -It is out freedom of choice to value the humans in front of us. We don't fully understand what we're sacrificing when we multitask.
- -This is not just a middle school issue, we need to all be a part of the solution and set an example for younger students -Dan Environmental Club could help out? Encouraging self-reflection and such in nature

Brooke- Making electronics off limits makes them more appealing. Social concept would be more effective, no hard and fast rule. Social media is different from playing a game from doing homework.

Casey: We've added a lot of activities, hope these continue but Halloween started as TA driven, then turned into full school activities

Roll of TA in high school? For fun or for strictly academic planning? How do we not put too much on teachers for planning

Henry: students have little involvement in passing of Halloween schedule Eleanor: put leadership role to juniors (rising seniors) Brooke: how do we distribute leadership? We need to change middle school culture because they do not know they can bring stuff up at town meeting? They CAN organize. Is it a good idea to have mandatory town meeting for middle schoolers? IT can dissuade them from coming.

Jamie- worried about culture changes at town meeting and kids not knowing their responsibilities Eleanor- senior class goes to sixth grade and teaches them about town meeting to get them more involved

Henry- seniors and sixth grader work together- put responsibility on them, system is corrupt, take a stand to make sure students pass it or not have the event happen Jennifer- Keep valuable traditions, get rid of not valuable traditions, town meeting allows us to be new

and reflect on our current values, allow new traditions

Brooke- get middle schoolers more involved with decisions, their own activities (dances, etc).

Dan- 6th and 7th graders do town meeting training

Tom- there is no apocalyptic change in town meeting, other high schoolers have fun or academics, they know town meeting is going on they just don't care, and that's okay. Build scaffolding, bare minimum of support for students who then lead stuff

Nathaniel-situation not so dire, actions taken that lessen the support of town meeting has hurt the integrity of town meeting (symbolic point), issues because things can't get passed because of activity blocks, some teachers make students come during town meeting, hard to get middle schoolers to feel comfortable in town meeting Dave- in 1989 we formed committee to get students to come to town meeting, teachers better than in the past about scheduling

during ™, community action events earlier in the year builds community early on Anne- Leadership class gives students opportunity to connect with teachers and organize and facilitate problem solving Jamie- leadership class may diminish the importance of town meeting

Josue- people don't realize they can do stuff about things until you take it away, let them know you can do all of these things

Carol- only 15 kids in leadership class that decide everything? We need to have a balance, how is information dispersed on the grade level? Communication at the end of year necessary Graham- activity block was direct result of structured middle school TAs, sixth graders use town meeting as free block because they don't have a lot of free time Brooke- you can't force people to come to town meeting Carly said middle school didn't really change much

Bill: Not about taking away free time, about more project based learning, more AID days, helps increase student time management skills Jacob: Heard support for 9th grade proposal, but little info about how that money would be used Dave: community focus is lost most during growth, and resources should be used to regain that Question to Eleanor: Explain specific ideas for next year? Eleanor + Leigh + Bill: Zombie geography, project based learning, Rebecca: New time would be used for teachers to give one on one help to students, fill need

Carl: Speak to proposal for math course for extra class, ask 8th grade if a .2 reduction to proposal, then scaled back to .6, then reduced to .4, have compromised Casey: 9th grade has also reduced their proposal, hard to put toothpaste back in tube, now is maybe not the time for all these proposals to be fixed, a conversation about TAs will be needed

Casey: Need to wrap up conversation, close to finishing proposal, need to cut .2, math

students view new TA program in positive light, adding it to 8th grade, need more allocation to support full-time TA for 8th grade, total allocation needed would be .8, 6th and 7th grade have determined Core + is not needed, Core + would be cut from 8th grade and replaced with TA, actual needed amount is .6 .25 is about what is available, unusual position, Questions:

Would 8th grade teachers teach less, or would core teachers teach one less class?

Core teachers teach 5 instead of 6 and teach a TA now, changes occur naturally to avoid new teachers being required

Not a current perfect solution for math compared to other classes, but it will remain intact as determined later

This new TA class is important and good for 8th graders, and Dave will

do something like having a smaller TA to fix this problem

Does the English Request involve any new staff? No.

Does the Social Studies request require new staff? A philosophy teacher is needed, so yes Support for Philosophy, Paul is offering to possibly help teach philosophy

Fine Arts is asking to take back their .1, to possibly find a use for it later, as long as it still works for other classes A new proposal could be made for this

Where are the STEM classes in this proposal, currently robotics, Comp sci, and others are spread between many teachers, hopefully next year a comp sci teacher could be hired to increase consistency Proposal to set aside .2 for STEM classes, need for 3rd AP stat, if there is extra allocation another AP stat block

An idea about spreading allocation around for instructional leave days

for teachers to plan for TA activities

Fine Arts planned their request thinking there was a deficit, now they would like to have it back Full time STEM would be interesting, impressive abilities would be required to teach all STEM, if any departments want new things now would be the time to think of those, fine arts -.1 is not so much a loss as it is a lateral change to a different department A TA planning block would be helpful for everyone, ninth grade

bubble is another situation that could be addressed with this new allocation

If we have an extra .25, it might make sense to approve our base and spend some extra time to plan what we're bringing, motion to approve this and let departments reconvene for future plans Good motion, but don't want to cut off discussion about current base too soon Motion withdrawn for the time being

High school TAs do have a lot of stress and time would be very appreciated

Teachers have said that the 6th and 7th grade TA meetings are very good

Voice support for high schools also having planned TA

If the option was to return to the old way of TAs that would be okay No seniors were cut from classes, but some juniors were

Because it was almost an elective, rather than a math class, it was okayish to cut them from that

This is a strong alternative as a upper class math class that's not calculus

The TA program has been very successful in middle school and in high school that could be interesting

Would making TA more rigid help lower stress for high school teachers

Changing high school TA would be an important and large step, regardless of changing 8th grade as well

Middle and High school TAs are so different they're incomparable, high school TAs have so much more on their plate, and possibly over the future change the entire focus of TA Support Dave's proposal, 8th grade TA and High school TA changes are not one or the other, maybe High school TAs could meet to lower intensity and increase planning High school TAs being

misrepresented, completely spent

working with students and other teachers

There is no High school "Team", instead of comparing middle school to high school, open TA time is very valuable, support anything to lower stress for high school teachers If allocation was spent on middle school, could we go back and retrieve it, probably not Meghan idea very interesting Money from allocation could be used in many different various ways, like into outside teacher then

anywhere, but a plan would be needed to be more thought out and structured than current system Maybe another school-based sub to help, many ways to accomplish this, but more thought as to the goal would be needed Ninth grade teachers could sit down and discuss what is a good idea to change for the future, an overall unique plan would work better

Mentor system from older students, wildly varying TAs could be part of the problem, evening out

the numbers for several TAs could be easier, do 8th grade off campus privileges cause many to skip TA? In reality 2 planned TAs a week is not sustainable

If we went to this model, would kids lose privileges? Probably not Maybe a dedicated 8th grade TA would help off campus stay safer in the future

Any thoughts on the high school TA situation are legitimate, but do they relate to our current allocation situation?

Jobs cannot be compared easily

Will the 6th and 7th grade plan help make 8th grade TAs easier if 8th grade adopts it? Yes? Planning ahead TAs Maybe a day after school ends could be used to continue these discussions

6th grade plan has helped fix some problems, and this could be implemented otherwise, and this new system has really helped, and maybe this could be adopted as a school-wide system, changing the philosophy could be welcome

Lack of kid participation in these decisions changes how they're gonna work

Student input is very important to discuss a new high school TA system

The middle school structured TA system would not be pulled up completely

Support pulling system up to 8th grades, it's a matter of time to fix this

This kind of meeting is very useful as a staff to talk about these kinds of situations

Even for those high school teachers without TAs Planning blocks for future TAs with a sub teaching would not work for any teachers, possibly extra time would be useful Current group activities like the camping trip would be very useful A group of student resource teachers could be useful to help relieve the stress load for many high school teachers Middle school 8th grade TA changes would be valuable, High

school TA one of the most useful things for high schoolers Student input would be valuable when discussing this Repeating that there are always kids around looking for help Apologize for noise, Time Turners solution for this, college recommendations are hard to balance many of them, maybe a huge amount of money could be set aside for this purpose Vision of changing TAs might not be possible with this current available amount, maybe this extra allocation could be better saved as a buffer for the future. Better to have it and not need it rather than need it and not have it? This will always be something to think about

Maybe start working towards a resolution, this could possibly be pushed back one week but definitely not beyond that "If you build it, they will come" if 33% (50%) more time was added to community building in middle school, maybe that would reduce stress for high schoolers

Remembering middle school TAs is fond, now in high school it's tougher to organize these kinds of things, don't want to give up after-school time, all time spent with students, not guilty, but sad Increase students and increased demand

New students parents must be acclimatized to HB, and seniors get full attention especially for beginning of year, insane level of stress, love working with kids, but it's not that easy

Kid input very important to this kind of discussion

Should this be postponed until town meeting, small groups? Meet 5 days a week

The current allotment is not enough to give an extra block to every teacher

Maybe there could be something like a trip planner, who gets an extra .2 to plan trips for the 9th grade or something like that What if the topic of the town meeting next tuesday is about this instead of allocation

Maybe something like office hours or a college counselor would be helpful to reduce the workload, amazing how there is no guidance counselor, maybe this could help students

What would this kind of allocation be? Our 3.0 guidance counselor has been turned into other teachers

Maybe a guidance counselor is a good idea, helps at other schools, administrative assistant would be useful

Maybe high school teachers having to spend a large amount of time outside of the classroom re-teaching lessons could find a better system Is there any proposal? Put forth Dave's motion, everything as written

Reminder: if you're voting against this, do you have a better idea? If we have this kind of person, running stuff for the 9th grade team

11th graders turning in PSPs said they would've loved to had a

person to go to for help, maybe we could have someone like that Maybe on next thursday we have another allocation meeting the second block to discuss this more 8th grade team thought process: students came in and brought forth what they wanted TA to accomplish, relieves stress when 8th graders want more from TA, and 8th graders still want more Some students wanted an emotional safe space but lacked the time and space for that

Over time we decided we wanted a change, other parts of the staff have already gotten stuff, and maybe now it's up for us to get something, but high school changes would also benefit many people

There is a calculus exam that would conflict

Changing High school TA would be a hard transition

Maybe now it would be good to take a vote
