H-B Woodlawn Philosophy

- 4 Pillars
- Self Governance
- Self-DirectedLearning
- Caring Community
- Equity



Self-Governance



- Town Meeting: Held weekly. Students are treated equally with adults.
- Use of Time/Personal Behavior
 - With freedom comes responsibility (rights and responsibilities)
 - Accountable for the consequences of their actions
 - Incrementally increasing freedom and expectations of responsibility

Self-Directed Learning

- Designed to provide our students with more control over their education
- Easiest to take advantage of the freedom and choice at HBW if students are self-motivated and self-directed
- Opportunities increase incrementally



Caring Community

- Small size
- Teacher Advisor system (student choice)
- Student-teacher relationships



Equity

- More purposeful than "once-a-year" festivals
- Deliberate bi-weekly conversations about race, ethnicity, gender, religion and how all of our differences make us important parts of the larger community.
- Addresses inequity, discrimination, bullying.



Typical 6th grade day

- Majority of students ride the bus
- Students have core classes in the morning (same 5 core classes as other schools)
 - Heterogeneous grouping except for math
- Lunch (where they choose, "recess")
- Elective courses (PE, Drama, Art, Music, World Language)
 - Latin, French, Spanish (Chinese and Arabic in 7th grade, ASL in 8th)
- Courses only meet 4x per week
- Back on the bus



Typical 9th grade day


- Vast majority of students take the bus countywide busing is provided
- Seven blocks per day (50 minutes each)
- Town Meeting (1x per week)
- TA (3x per week)
- "I" Block 3-4x per week
- Equity & Community block (1x per week)
- 1 lunch period (open campus with parent permission)

Other Differences




- Few after school activities (ultimate frisbee, but few if any clubs after school)
- CAN play high school sports
- Can NOT play middle school sports
- No "continuous adult supervision." Students must manage themselves and their time
 - Off campus privileges

 - Talk with your student about the experience
